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The St. Louis Learning Disabilities Association's (LDA) individualized, one-on-one ACT/SAT preparation sessions are designed to explicitly teach students structure and strategies.

Topics include:

- Design and structure of the actual test.
- How to manage time when taking the test.
- Phrasing possible questions and possible answers.
- General review of high school content.
- Tools to help maneuver through and take the test.
- Reading comprehension strategies.
- Math strategies.

Students attend sessions twice a week with a certified special educator. Students will also have the opportunity to take several practice tests and practice skills that are assessed in both the ACT and SAT. The length of the individualized preparation course will be determined by the needs of the student.

The Real ACT Prep Guide and the Official Study Guide, 2nd Edition, will be utilized in the sessions. Students are required to purchase their own copies of the study guides.
